

KEY - COMPARING LONG HUNTERS TO INDIAN HUNTERS:

Complete the following chart:

Characteristic	Native Americans	Long Hunters
Describe the differences in clothing	Very little clothing, feathers, beads. No shoes	Coat, pants, boots, hat, high collared shirt
Why they hunted animals	For food and clothing; for trading	To sell the skins; for trading
Hunting equipment they used	Bows and arrows and blow darts	Guns
The animal parts they used	Nearly all – meat, skin, bone, “sinew”	Primarily the skin (fur)
Types of animals they hunted	Variety, including deer, bear, rabbit	Those with the most valuable fur

After long hunters and settlers began hunting in Tennessee, what do you think was effect the wildlife population?

The abundance of game animals probably decreased over time.

What effect do you think the long hunters had on the Indians’ ability to trade animal skins for European goods?

The Native Americans had to compete with the Long Hunters to hunt and the value of the skins in trading may have decreased.
